The new Changing Place facility in Holland Park

Exciting news: As requested by Access Group, and part of our ongoing campaign for provision of more fully accessible disabled toilets and Changing Places facilities, the Council has now installed a new Changing Places Facility in Holland Park! Also, some of the aroup's members took part on Wednesday 19th July (Changing Places awareness day) in a launch event in Holland Park with the Council's officers, Lead Members Councillor Sarah Addenbroke and Councillor Emma Will and media to celebrate and promote the opening of this brand-new facility there.

Unlike a standard accessible toilet, the Changing Places



toilets offer more space and can accommodate two carers and another person/ wheelchair/mobility user. They also include a height adjustable toilet, height adjustable sink, an adultsized changing bench, a hoist and shower.

As Cllr Emma Will, Lead Member for Culture and Leisure, said: "This new facility means far more people can now enjoy Holland Park, or go to the shops on High Street Kensington, or visit the Design Museum without having to worry about planning their journey''.
