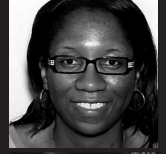

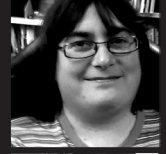

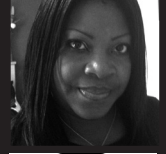

Feedback on New Housing Policy

Theresa McGrady, ADKC's Voice of Experience Co-ordinator reports on the Positive Rights Action Group's (PRAG) recent success...

Staff from RBKC attended as guests at the Voice of Experience/PRAG meetings and the feedback was incorporated into the new policy, which I received last autumn.

The main questions/concerns that Members had raised were:

- How to report a repair job.
- The length of time waiting for repairs to be carried out.
- Choice over appointment times.
- The importance of minimising mess and the need to ensure space for disabled people to get

about while repairs are carried out.

The policy sections that cover the above points are sections 8, 9, 10, 11 & 15. Section 18 covers the Council's commitment to involving residents.

ADKC and VoE/PRAG Group member Steph Vaz has provided feedback:

We met with the council through the Voice of Experience Project last year to discuss the housing repairs policy.

The RBKC staff we met were really engaging and made me feel comfortable to speak. They listened to our personal experiences when it comes to repairs and also our suggestions on how to make it a better experience for disabled tenants. I was sceptical about our suggestions being used but

now I have seen the new policy I am so proud to see they have listened to ADKC members and have actually adopted our ideas. This is an amazing step towards making the lives of disabled people more accessible.

It's great to see that when the council want to listen to us, they can. I look forward to being part of more projects like this.
